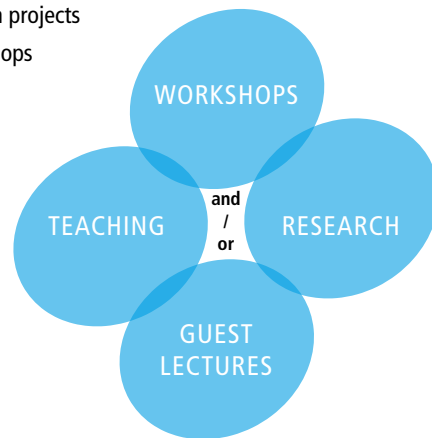


COOPERATION
